Cremation and the Church

Through the ages, Christians have stated their belief in the life to come with the words from the Apostle Creed: "I believe...in the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting." But Christians have always been quick to point out that the resurrection hope does not depend on the presentation of one's mortal remains.

The power of the resurrection applies every bit as much to those who have died from explosives or accidents, or those whose bodies cannot be recovered, as it does to those whose bodies are burned in a crematory.

Cremation, therefore, is entirely consistent with a Christian's understanding of the resurrection.

1 Corinthians 15:51-55:

Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed—in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality. When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory."
