In honor of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day this weekend, we have selected some pieces of music that were meaningful to him. The hymn "Precious Lord, Take My Hand," was his personal favorite, and he often requested Mahalia Jackson to sing it at rallies and services. She performed it at his funeral in 1968. Another favorite of Dr. King's was "There is a Balm in Gilead," and he shared his thoughts in a sermon given at Mount Pisgah Baptist Missionary Church in Chicago on April 27, 1967. Pastor Katie will read an excerpt this morning. We pray you find these pieces of music as inspiring as Dr. King did as we remember and celebrate his life's work for civil rights and social justice, and may they inspire us as we find our own way to respond to God's invitation to mission and ministry.
